This is a quick update on the project as I have just heard from the contractor that the concrete subcontractor will begin caulking the expansion joints and saw-cuts on the completed sidewalk as early as tomorrow. This material is extremely tacky until it cures so we are asking anyone who walks through the area to be mindful to not step on it. The curing takes time depending on weather and temperature. Also if you have any of your items or materials on the new sidewalk please try to remove them from the work areas so that the crews can install the caulking and sealant.
