I will answer your questions\concerns in the order you put them in your email.

- 1. The pictures you sent showing the gaps between the new sidewalk and existing buildings still require a caulking\joint sealing to finish the work. Not sure when this will occur but should be within the next few weeks. That will effectively fill the gaps and areas with a watertight caulk.
- 2. Your comment with regard to the slope of the sidewalks on the west side of 300 block. The plans created a positive slope form the buildings to the curb\gutter but there are times where matching new work to existing buildings may have required it to be flat or appear to be sloped the wrong way. This will be something the design engineer will check to make sure the work is consistent with the engineering plans.
- 3. As far as any damage to your awning during the removal of the tree you will need to contact Casey Slone directly to file any claim for those damages. His office can be reached at 903-926-6664.
- 4. With regards to the flooding\buildup of stormwater along Austin St. that is purely a function of system capacity. When we get these heavy rainfalls like we have experienced this year so far the stormwater system struggles to keep up if not gets completely inundated. This is something that the City is looking at as we prepare a new stormwater\drainage master plan which will identify system insufficiencies and determine the required upgrades and priorities. Drainage crews also try and clean out the inlet boxes as often as possible but with three crew members that task is daunting for sure.

I would love to have an answer, I also sent you an email about flooding on my 102 East Austin Street about two months ago and no answer yet.

If the city is not responsible for the damages please provide me with the information to whom I should speak to or direct my claims to resolve this negligent acts.
