I raised my Son primarily by myself from an infant until age of 7 years old. 1 year ago, due to circumstances that may be able to be understood in the attached summary of my situation, I agreed to allow his Step Father to adopt him due to the financial benefits that I will never be able to provide in my lifetime.

Recently I reviewed [what was filed at the courthouse](#) which are papers that are not what I signed at Ned Dennis office. Furthermore, I understand he has not filed the papers he labeled "[TERM & ADOPT - Signed Father's Affidavit](#)"

Diane Solomon called Ned Dennis office for her husband Attorney Vernard Solomon and was told that the "[TERM & ADOPT - Signed Father's Affidavit](#)" was not filed because my Son is still in transition from staying with my mother to moving with his mother in Dallas Texas. Mr. Vernard Solomon and his wife have always been great people in my eyes, however, time is passing and he has stopped handling any cases regarding family law.

I called my mother and inquired if things had changed or if Jim was still adopting little Larry, she explained that as far as she knew nothing changed. She stated she was also confused why the papers were not filed as of yet.

The only reason I was aware that Mr. Dennis had not concluded the matter is the [attached letter I received from the Attorney Generals Office](#) which prompted my looking into the matter.

1 year ago was a very low point for me in my life in every aspect and I understand many of the decisions I made were not sound, including addressing a matter as serious as this without legal representation. I need help from an attorney to review the matter to determine what is actually transpiring.
